THE BICYCLE ALLIANCE ADVOCATES, EDUCATES AND COMMUNICATES ON BEHALF OF BICYCLISTS:


- We educate local and state officials on the importance of bicycle-friendly communities and cycling as a viable transportation option.

- We partner with law enforcement, schools, bike clubs and others to promote bicycle safety and a *Share the Road* philosophy.
- We develop and distribute newsletters, Action Alerts and other information throughout the state.
